Highway at West Yaphank from Swezey's Mills Westerly

At a Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Highways of the Town of Brookhaven held in the Village of West Yaphank on Monday June 2d/79. all the Commissioners having been duly notified to attend and deliberate on the subject embraced in this order and all being present it was ordered that Whereas a Road leading from Swezey's Mills Westerly was laid out upwards of One Hundred years ago by the Commissioners of Highways of this Town and Whereas said road has been encroached on in various portions by owners and occupants of land on either side and has never been surveyed and properly defined it was—Resolved that a survey be made by Justus Roe which was as follows, viz:

Commencing at a point about One Hundred and Fifty feet Westerly from the Mill, near the centre of the roadway leading into the Brook, and Thirteen feet S. of a large double locust tree on the Bank and running S. 73° 15′ W 180 feet to a stake thence varying S. 2° 28′ on a Course S. 70° 43′ W. 618 feet to a stake in the centre of the road leading to Coram.
